As the first member of the stage crew, he also handled training of two additional stage crew members when they joined the show late in Tech Week. When the run of the show was over, Alex received kudos from the stage manager, the director, and members of the cast. He also received a handwritten thank you note from the props designer, sent two weeks after the show closed.


